The Council will encourage mentally ill people to voice their feelings whilst staying in a mental health institution, by providing volunteers who will visit and listen to their views.	2	18,000

The second year is conditional upon the group providing SORP compliant accounts.	Islington Deaf Campaign is a campaigning and lobbying organisation that seeks to influence policy and practice in relation to services for deaf people and seeks to raise awareness of the discrimination faced by them. The Foundation has provided funding for the salary of a part-time Co-ordinator for the organisation to help build capacity and to develop its current infrastructure and service delivery.	2	30,000

Clapham and Stockwell Faith Forum bring together local people, of all faiths and none, to encourage understanding and strengthen the local community. It runs a range of peace-building and reconciliation activities and convenes round table discussions on national and international issues affecting local people. The Trust has provided funding to continue and develop its monthly womens-only art group. The aim of the activity is to bring together women of different backgrounds who would not normally socialise, particularly women from new migrant communities with women from more established communities. They will be encouraged to share skills and art forms from their own cultural heritage that others can learn.	1	8,000
Ethiopian Women's Empowerment Group	Kensington and Chelsea	over two years, £7,000 in each year towards the salary and on-costs of a part-time Co-ordinator.	Ethiopian Women's Empowerment Group caters for refugee and asylum seeking women from Ethiopia and Eritrea. The activities offered include; language classes, health workshops, coffee morning and advice & information on local services.	2	14,000
French African Welfare Association	Croydon	over two years, being £14,000 in Year One and £11,000 in Year Two towards the salary of a part-time Co-ordinator and running costs.	French African Welfare Association provides support to people from French speaking countries who have settled in London. It offers a drop-in and referral service giving advice on welfare and health matters, workshops on health issues such as HIV/AIDS and sexual health, supplementary education classes and a range of cultural events. The Foundation has provided funding towards the salary of the Coordinator and running costs.	2	25,000

The Foundation has provided funding for the salary of a part-time Co-ordinator for the organisation to help build capacity and to develop its current infrastructure and service delivery.	2	18,000

The Foundation has provided funding towards the costs of a sessional ICT tutor, classroom support, materials and running costs.	2	12,000
Bow Bengali Forum	Tower Hamlets	over two years, (being £8,000 in each year) for sessional tutors and a contribution to the running costs of mother-tongue classes and parental workshops.	Bow Bengali Forum is a community-led organisation which supports disadvantaged Bangladeshi families to address their social, welfare, health and educational needs. It provides a range of services including mother-tongue and supplementary classes, welfare rights advice and information, outreach work, summer playschemes and cultural events. The Trust provided funding for sessional tutors and a contribution to the running costs of its mother-tongue classes and parental workshops.	2	16,000
Bromley Somali Community Association	London-wide	over two years, being £6,000 in each year, for sessional tutors and a contribution to running cost of mother-tongue classes and parent workshops.	Bromley Somali Community Association provides advice to the local Somali community on housing, welfare benefits, education and health and also provides supplementary and mother-tongue classes for mainly Somali children. Kongolese Children's Association is a parent-led group, formed to address the underachievement of children from Congo, Congo Brazza and Angola. It runs supplementary and mother tongue classes and offers advice and guidance to parents on educational developments of refugee children.	2	16,000
LWO Cultural Group	London-wide	over two years (being £5,000 in each year) towards the costs of the mother-tongue classes, conditional on the adoption of a child protection policy.	Lwo Cultural Group supports people from the Lwo community in Uganda. TFL is funding its mother-tongue classes in the Acholi language for children, who also participate in the group's traditional song and dance rehearsals.	2	10,000
Middlesex Tamil Academy	Harrow	being £4,000 in each year, towards rental costs for classes.	Middlesex Tamil Academy is a supplementary and mother tongue school, supporting children and parents of Tamil origin. It runs classes at a local secondary school on Saturdays, in addition also runs cultural activities. The Trust approved grants towards rent and tutors' salaries.	2	8,000

Richmond Avicenna Supplementary School	Wandsworth	over two years towards the cost of sessional mother-tongue tutors and running costs. The first payment is conditional upon the group providing SORP compliant accounts for financial year 2006-07.	Richmond Avicenna Supplementary School provides mother-tongue and supplementary education classes to children of asylum seekers and refugees from Afghanistan in the borough of Richmond-upon-Thames. The Foundation has provided funding towards the costs of mother-tongue tutors and running costs of the school.	2	10,000
